
FORMATION E-LEARNING DANSE CLASSIQUE EN 3 SEMAINES!

It builds on a wealth of knowledge, expertise and documented materials acquired and produced by the three organisations over the last few years




The development of the eLearning Course is work in progress


The pilot is expected to be finished April 2009

About the Course

Background

Welcome to the eLearning Course on Effective Electoral Assistance.

This eLearning Course is the result of sustained cooperation efforts undertaken over the last years by the European Commission, the United Nations Development Programme and International Institute for Democracy Electoral Assistance (International IDEA) in the field of electoral assistance. The Course has been created on the basis of the content and the structure of the Training Manual of the "Joint Training on Effective Electoral Assistance", a global training initiative developed and launched by the three institutions.

As already for the Training Manual, the eLearning Course on Effective Electoral Assistance primarily draws on the content of the following four core sources:

- · the EC Methodological Guide on Electoral Assistance;
- the UNDP Electoral Assistance Implementation Guide;
- International IDEA's Handbook on Electoral Management Design; and
- · the ACE Focus on Effective Electoral Assistance.

The collaboration between the EC and UNDP started in 1995, and it was in 2004 that it was strongly intensified through the support to the electoral processes in the Democratic Republic of Congo and the establishment of a **Strategic Partnership Agreement** (SPA) that strengthened and formalised the relational focus between the two institutions with the signature of a **Memorandum of Understanding** (MoU).

The primary objective of the Strategic Partnership between the EC and UNDP has been to facilitate policy dialogue and specific collaboration at global, regional and country level, creating harmonization, complementarity and financial cooperation between the two institutions.

Pilot Project dedicated to the production and distribution via satellite of eLearning modules on Effective Electoral Assistance.

Creation of specific eLearning module on Electoral Administration for the specific case of the DRC to be used by the Independent Electoral Commission for training of staff.

The eLearning modules will be integrated within the SatElections Training Platform and delivered to remote terminals via the satellite communication system.

Utilised for training of staff before the holding of the next Congolese local elections




